

Curriculum Description: Third Grade - Islamic Studies

To familiarize students with foundational concepts in Islam, instilling love and appreciation for their faith and building a basic understanding of Islamic practices and stories from the Prophet's life.

This curriculum aims to teach students important skills through the instruction of the following content:

- Principles of Islam and Faith
- Tawheed (Monotheism) and the Beautiful Names of Allah Almighty
- The Holy Quran – Meaning, Interpretation and Recitation
- Sunnah & Seerah - The Life and Teachings of the Prophet
- Stories of the Prophets and Companions
- Acts of Worship & Fiqh (The Islamic Jurisprudence)
- Obligations and Manners in Islam

To effectively educate students on these subjects and impart particular skills, various teaching techniques are employed. These include live videos featuring instructors, visual presentations, interactive exercises, educational games, animations, storytelling, online interactive exams, AI based teaching and exams, and a variety of evaluation methods, including delivering individual feedback along with correct answers.
