

Curriculum Description - Grade 2 Islamic Studies

To familiarize students with foundational concepts in Islam, instilling love and appreciation for their faith and building a basic understanding of Islamic practices and stories from the Prophet's life.

This curriculum aims to teach students important skills through the instruction of the following content:

- Foundations of Belief:
 - Tawhid (Oneness of Allah): Introduce the concept of the oneness of Allah and its significance.
 - Books of Allah: Basic knowledge of the Quran and other scriptures sent down by Allah to various prophets.
 - Pillars of Islam and Faith.
- The purified Prophetic Sunnah and his life.
- Surahs (Chapters): Basic understanding and memorization of short Surahs.
- Stories from the lives of the noble Companions and Prophets.
- Obligations and Manners in Islam
- Sunnah & Seerah - The Life and Teachings of the Prophet
- Acts of Worship & Fiqh (Islamic jurisprudence)
- Islamic creed (Aqeedah).

To effectively educate students on these subjects and impart particular skills, various teaching techniques are employed. These include live videos featuring instructors, visual presentations, interactive exercises, educational games, animations, storytelling, online interactive exams, AI based teaching and exams, and a variety of evaluation methods, including delivering individual feedback along with correct answers.
